



Also present were Scouts who attended Camp Drake throughout the 80 years, former Camp Staff members and dedicated volunteers who have continued to keep Camp Drake a vibrant camp for nearly a century.

In the spring of 2012 the family of Jamie Ping announced a gift to Prairielands Council to construct a Trap & Skeet Range at the Harold Nogle Shooting Sports Center at Camp Robert Drake. Jeff & Jeanette Ping present the gift in memory of their son, Eagle Scout Jamie Ping, who was tragically killed in a car accident in 2011. Construction of the range began in the fall and will be completed for the 2013 summer camp season.



One of the more urgent needs at Camp Drake has been adequate housing for summer camp staff members. In 2012 a design for new staff cabins was created to replace current facilities. Jack Jones, Jones Construction, and David Crow, TCT Construction, teamed together to build the first two cabins. The duplex cabins house 2-4 staff members and will be available for rental during the off season.

.....and looks to the future with Camp Development Plan

After a two year study the Camp Drake Development Plan has completed the first phase. The appointed ad hoc committee reviewed Camp Drake facility and program needs for the next 20 years. The plan has now been passed to the Council Properties and Program Committees for review and further recommendations. In 2013 the plan will be sent to the Executive Board for review, approval and implementation.
