

Cub Scout Adventure Camp

CHECKLIST

Prior to camp

- Turn in a camp reservation form with your \$25 deposit.
- Arrange for a Camp Drake Promotional Night at a pack meeting.
- Pay fees early to avoid late charges.
- Double check adult leadership for every night.
- Notify parents of all plans and emergency numbers.
- Inventory and service any pack equipment to be used at camp.
- Go over Adventure Camp program, camp rules & policies with your Scouts.
- Select Adventure Camp programs for the Cubs to attend; preview badge requirements
- Secure all adult and Scout Health Histories. Ensure only the BSA form is used, and that all sections have been completed.
- Notify Camp Director of any special needs for camping arrangements or scheduling issues.
- Notify **only** CampDrakeKitchen@gmail.com with any special dietary needs ***at least two weeks*** prior to your unit's arrival at camp. Please communicate singularly about your Scout's dietary needs with this e-mail contact to avoid miscommunication.

Arrival at CAMP DRAKE

You should plan to arrive on first day of your week at camp, between 1:00 - 3:00 p.m. Units unable to arrive during this time should make prior arrangements with the Camp Director. Upon arrival in the parking lot, a staff guide will welcome you and assist you in the check-in process. The staff guide will take your troop to the designated campsite and assist with your set-up.

After dropping off your equipment and doing a little primary set-up, your guide will lead your unit to the location of the medical re-checks. Please have Scout and adult Health Histories on hand to turn over to the Health Officer. The pack will then have their orientation and swim check in the pool, and a briefing on dining hall procedures. Your pack will then have an opportunity to return to camp to complete their set-up.

The first day supper will be the first meal served, and will be at 5:45 pm. The first flag ceremony is at 5:35 pm. After dinner there will be a leaders meeting, additional tours of camp for Scouts, and the opening campfire hosted by the Camp Staff in the arena.

Pack trailers will be allowed in campsites, but will need to be transported by official camp vehicles and staff. Personal vehicles will not be permitted in campsites.

The Important Listing for Any Campers

- Physical Form**
- Proper Clothing - for all the days of camp**
 - Uniform** (for evening meals & campfire programs)
 - Comfortable shoes** (at least two pairs)
 - Plenty of socks** (plenty of foot transportation)
 - Pants or shorts**
 - Shirts**
 - Underwear**
 - Swimming Suit (packed on top)**
 - Jacket & Cap**
 - Raincoat/Rain gear**
- Personal Items**
 - Towel & Toiletries**
 - Sleeping bag**
 - Pillow**
 - Canteen or water bottle**
 - Flashlight** (and batteries)
- Optional (but helpful)**
 - Bug repellent**
 - Sun protection/small first aid kit**
 - Watch/whistle**
 - Notebook/pen or pencils**
 - Scout handbook** (in a waterproof baggie)
 - Sunglasses**
 - Fishing pole & tackle** (camp does have some)
 - Sports equipment** (camp does have some)
 - Campfire Chair** (for around the campsite)
 - Money** (for trading post souvenirs or snacks)
 - Trail food/water** (do not store food in your tent overnight!)
